### **Online Learning Platform**

The course will be hosted on Agora. Participants will need to register for a free account with Agora to do the course. Access details will be emailed to the participants by the e-tutor a week in advance of the course start date.

#### **Course Modules**

The five modules include: The Convention on the Rights of the Child; Rights Respecting Classroom; Child Participation; Global Citizenship; Whole School Approach. Participants will receive the enrollment key to enter each module when the previous one is completed

#### **Time**

The Department of Education requires a minimum 20 hours participation with the course content. A minimum 15 of these hours must be online. Participant online engagement will be recorded. A minimum of five hours participation will be done offline, such as reading and course assignments. The course is not live, so participants can work at their own pace between 1st – 30th July. Some people do it in less than a week, others take the full month.

#### **Assessment**

There will be a reflection assignment at the end of each module such as developing lesson plans and contributing to discussion forums. Participants will also be required to keep a learning log as they they progress through the modules.
