
The impact of ongoing war across the Gaza Strip continues to devastate civilian lives, leading to casualties, displacement and mass destruction of homes and essential infrastructure. The death toll has surpassed 33,000 people, with more than 14,500 children and 9,500 women reported killed. The conflict poses a direct threat to the lives of approximately 2.3 million residents of the Gaza Strip, half of whom are children.

Despite enormous operational challenges, UNICEF has been able to reach over 1.6 million people with safe drinking water, 610,000 people with health supplies, over 162,000 children and caregivers with psychosocial support, and nearly 200,000 children with nutrition supplementation. In response to this crisis, we have mobilized supplies, surge staff, and other efforts to address urgent humanitarian needs. We continue high-level advocacy through all available channels to end the suffering of children.


€1,000 could supply high-energy biscuits and supplements to help prevent 100 children from developing malnutrition
